The Stewardship Committee is recommending that we raise the money by passing a paint can on a couple of Sundays. It is going to take 40 gallons of paint to do the building, so that is \$100/can. Let's see if we can do this in one Sunday. Any funds raised over the \$4,000 needed will be placed in the Building & Maintenance line item.

Dear Church Family,

I can't wait to preach the sermon this morning. It comes out of Matthew 18:21-35 and I've been meditating on its truths for most of the week. It begins with Peter asking if forgiving his brother seven times would suffice. Jesus replied "70 x 7." There's enough in those two verses to camp out for awhile but the parable Jesus tells next is about as powerful as anything I've ever read in Scripture. I hope you brought your Bibles, a pen with which to take sermon notes and the sermon outline in the bulletin. If we listen closely enough to God's voice in the text, virtually every one of us will have reason to get things right with God before the day is done ... and that's when we can get our joy back!

Last week, **you voted to select seven people to serve on a team.** This group will attend churches outside of Hernando County and see what God is doing and what kinds of churches He is blessing. Let's pray for these folks to be unified in their endeavor. We'll have them report back to us when they are ready. Here's the group: Drew Jordan, Debbie Shaw, Ed Gossard, Carolyn Fisher, Tori Wilson & Vince Martinez. Yep, you counted six, not seven. One member, not listed, will be unable to serve and so the team will replace him with someone else soon.
